VETOES

Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 649.

This bill establishes a mandatory minimum 5-year sentence for manufacturing, distributing, or dispensing "crack." A drug kingpin who performs this act is subject to a minimum 20-year sentence, maximum 40-year sentence, and a fine of not more than \$1 million.

House Bill 665, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 2, 1990, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 649.

Controlled Dangerous Substances - "Crack" Cocaine Base ("Crack") - Penalties

FOR the purpose of increasing the providing certain penalties for certain offenses involving the manufacture, distribution, dispensing, and possession with intent to distribute of bringing into, or transporting certain amounts of certain cocaine base known as "crack" cocaine; making it a felony for a drug kingpin to conspire to commit certain acts involving certain amounts of certain cocaine base; and generally relating to penalties for controlled dangerous substance offenses.
