THE UNITED STATES IS EXEMPT FROM FEDERAL TAXATION.

(B) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED UNDER THE TAX - PROPERTY ARTICLE, THE REAL PROPERTY AND TANGIBLE PERSONAL PROPERTY OF A CREDIT UNION INCORPORATED UNDER THE LAWS OF THIS STATE ARE SUBJECT TO STATE AND LOCAL TAXATION TO THE SAME EXTENT AS SIMILAR PROPERTY OF A CREDIT UNION INCORPORATED UNDER THE LAWS OF THE UNITED STATES IS SUBJECT TO STATE AND LOCAL TAXATION OR FEDERAL TAXATION.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1990.

AN ACT concerning

Office for Children, Youth, and Families

FOR the purpose of reorganizing certain programs for children, youth, and families in State government; changing the name and increasing the responsibilities of the Office for Children and Youth; transferring the State Coordinating Council for the Residential Placement of Handicapped Children to the Office for Children, Youth, and Families; expanding the membership of the local coordinating council; providing for a certain Interagency Coordinating Council to be appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate; transferring the Governor's Council on Adolescent Pregnancy to the Office for Children, Youth, and Families;
