SECTION 7. 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That nothing in this Act affects the term of office of an appointed member of any board, council, committee, or unit, and a person who is a member of such a unit on the effective date of this Act shall remain a member of that unit for the balance of the term to which the person was appointed, unless the person dies, resigns, or is removed pursuant to law.

SECTION 8. 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That all rules and regulations, guidelines, orders, plans, special funds, appropriations, grants, contracts, investigations, administrative and judicial proceedings, and any other duties and responsibilities associated with those units transferred by this Act shall continue in effect under the Office for Children, Youth, and Families.

SECTION ~~6. 9.~~ 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1990.
