(4) In addition to any other penalty or fine provided in this title, any person who is convicted of violating any provision of this title or any [rule or] regulation [promulgated pursuant to it] ADOPTED UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF THIS TITLE may have the license under which [he] THE PERSON operated in the commission of violation suspended or revoked by the court.

~~(2) FOR A VIOLATION OF THIS TITLE OR REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER IT CONCERNING THE HARVEST OR CREEL LIMITS FOR STRIPED BASS, COMMONLY KNOWN AS ROCKFISH, THE COURT MAY REVOKE A LICENSE FOR NOT LESS THAN 1 YEAR NOR MORE THAN 5 YEARS.~~

Dear Mr. Speaker:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 993.

This bill requires the Department of Housing and Community Development to provide operating assistance grants to certain nonprofit organizations under a two-year demonstration project scheduled to terminate on June 30, 1993. Funds may not exceed one percent of the budgeted monies in the Rental Housing Program Fund, the Homeownership Programs Fund, and the Special Loan Programs Fund.

Senate Bill 644, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 29, 1990, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 993.
