Dear Mr. Speaker:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 1206.

This bill prohibits unlawful subleasing of a motor vehicle, defines unlawful subleasing, and imposes misdemeanor penalties of a fine of not more than \$5,000 or imprisonment for not more than 3 years or both.

Senate Bill 710, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 29, 1990, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 1206.

House Bill No. 1206

AN ACT concerning

Motor Vehicles – Unlawful Subleasing

FOR the purpose of prohibiting subleases of motor vehicles by certain persons under certain circumstances, with certain exceptions; providing that certain illegal subleases of motor vehicles are misdemeanors, which may incur fines, imprisonment, or both; ~~providing for recovery of certain damages by certain persons injured by illegal subleases of motor vehicles under certain circumstances; providing for the award of equitable relief, restitution, punitive damages, costs, and attorney's fees under certain circumstances; prohibiting, under certain circumstances, the prosecution of a party to a motor vehicle agreement as an accessory to a crime under this Act; defining terms; making provisions of this Act severable; and generally relating to illegal subleases of motor vehicles.~~
