(a) In this subtitle, the following words have the meanings indicated.

(F) (1) “UNDERGROUND OIL STORAGE TANK” MEANS ONE OR MORE TANKS INCLUDING UNDERGROUND PIPES CONNECTED TO TANKS, WITH A VOLUME OF 10 PERCENT OR MORE BENEATH THE SURFACE OF THE GROUND.

(2) “UNDERGROUND OIL STORAGE TANK” DOES NOT INCLUDE A:

(I) TANK ON A FARM OR PRIVATE RESIDENCE WHICH STORES 1,100 GALLONS OR LESS OF OIL FOR NONCOMMERCIAL OR PERSONAL USE;

(II) SEPTIC TANK;

(III) PIPELINE FACILITY, INCLUDING GATHERING LINES REGULATED UNDER:

1. THE NATURAL GAS PIPELINE SAFETY ACT OF 1968, 49 U.S.C. APP. 1671, ET SEQ; OR

2. THE HAZARDOUS LIQUID PIPELINE SAFETY ACT OF 1979, 49 U.S.C. APP. 2001, ET SEQ;

(IV) INTRASTATE PIPELINE FACILITY REGULATED UNDER STATE LAWS COMPARABLE TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE LAW REFERRED TO IN SUBPARAGRAPH (III) OF THIS PARAGRAPH;

(V) SURFACE IMPOUNDMENT, PIT, POND, OR LAGOON;

(VI) STORMWATER OR WASTEWATER COLLECTION SYSTEM;

(VII) FLOW-THROUGH PROCESS TANK;

(VIII) STORAGE TANK SITUATED IN AN UNDERGROUND AREA, SUCH AS A BASEMENT, CELLAR, MINeworking, DRIFT, SHAFT, OR TUNNEL IF THE STORAGE TANK IS SITUATED UPON OR ABOVE THE SURFACE OF THE FLOOR; ~~OR~~

(IX) PIPE CONNECTED TO ANY TANK DESCRIBED IN SUBPARAGRAPHS (I) THROUGH (VIII) OF THIS PARAGRAPH; OR

(X) TANK USED FOR STORING HEATING OIL FOR CONSUMPTIVE USE ON THE PREMISES WHERE STORED.
