

(2) [An institution or agency that operates under the authority of] A FACILITY SPECIFICALLY ENUMERATED IN ARTICLE 83C, § 2-117 OF THE CODE WHICH IS OPERATED BY the Department of Juvenile Services and treats children who are adjudicated delinquent OR ARE ALLEGED TO BE DELINQUENT is a place of confinement for the purpose of this section. However, for an escape from a juvenile [institution or agency] FACILITY that does not involve an assault, the sentence may not exceed confinement for 3 years.

(3) If any individual escapes from a facility of the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene after commitment as incompetent to stand trial or not criminally responsible, the individual is guilty of a felony and on conviction is subject to confinement in the State penitentiary or a jail or house of correction for a period not exceeding 10 years.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1990.

CHAPTER 100

(Senate Bill 247)

AN ACT concerning

Dorchester County – Maintenance of Property

FOR the purpose of authorizing the Dorchester County Commissioners to enact ordinances that require the owners of real property to keep that property maintained in a certain way; enumerating factors to be controlled; permitting Dorchester County to perform the work and to assess the cost on the owner under certain conditions; making the unpaid cost a lien on the property and permitting its collection in a certain way; and generally relating to the maintenance of real property in Dorchester County.
