- (i) "Green pelt" means a pelt which is not dried, cured, or tanned.
- (j) "Hunt" means to pursue, capture, catch, kill, gig, trap, shoot, or attempt to pursue, capture, catch, kill, gig, trap, or shoot, or in any manner reduce any bird or mammal to personal possession. However, "hunt" may not be construed to include the sport of fox chasing.
- [(k) "Migratory birds" means those birds protected by the Migratory Bird Treaty Act and by international convention treaties and listed in the Code of Federal Regulations.]
- [(1)] (K) "Nighttime" means the time beginning one half hour after sunset and ending one half hour before sunrise the following day, as published in the Department's hunter's guide, unless this title provides otherwise.
- [(m)] (L) "Nongame birds and mammals" means every wild mammal and bird not classified as game birds and mammals or any part, egg, offspring, or dead body of any of them.
- [(n)] (M) "Open season" means the time, when a person lawfully may hunt game birds and mammals and it includes both the first and last day of the season or period designated by this title.
- [(0)] (N) "Person" means the State, any county, municipal corporation, or other political subdivision of the State, or any of their units, or an individual, receiver, trustee, guardian, executor, administrator, fiduciary, or representative of any kind, or any partnership, firm, association, public or private corporation, or any other entity.
- [(p)] (O) "Protected birds" means any wild bird not included within the definition of "game bird" or "unprotected bird" or any part, egg, offspring, or dead body of any of them.
- [(q)] (P) "Resident" includes a member of the armed forces of the United States who is on active duty and stationed officially in the State.
 - [(r)] (Q) "Secretary" means Secretary of Natural Resources.
- [(s)] (R) "Unprotected bird" means any English sparrow and European starling or any part, egg, offspring, or dead body of any of them.
 - [(t)] (S) "Unprotected mammal" means nutria and woodchuck.
- [(u)] (T) "Upland game birds and mammals" means upland game birds (blackbirds, crows, doves, pheasant, quail, and woodcock) and upland game mammals (rabbit and hare) or any part, egg, offspring, or dead body of any of them, INCLUDING BIRDS RAISED IN CAPTIVITY AND RELEASED TO THE WILD OR OTHERWISE USED FOR HUNTING PURPOSES.
- [(v)] (U) "Wetland game birds" means brant, coots, ducks, gallinules, geese, mergansers, rails, snipe, and swan or any part, egg, offspring, or dead body of any of them, INCLUDING BIRDS RAISED IN CAPTIVITY AND RELEASED TO THE WILD OR OTHERWISE USED FOR HUNTING PURPOSES.
