- (1) Be a resident of this State; and
- (2) At the time of his initial application, be a resident of the legislative district from which he seeks appointment.
- (d) Each applicant shall demonstrate to the State Scholarship Board a definite financial need.
- (e) Each applicant shall accept any other conditions attached to the award. [18-601.
  - (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
- (2) "Child" means any child who is at least 15 years old and under the age of 24 of any State or local public safety employee killed in the line of duty.
  - (3) "Spouse" means a person who:
- (i) Is legally married to any State or local public safety employee at the time that the public safety employee is killed in the line of duty; and
  - (ii) Has not remarried.
  - (4) "State or local public safety employee" means:
    - (i) A career or volunteer member of a:
      - 1. Fire department;
      - 2. Ambulance company or squad; or
      - 3. Rescue company or squad;
    - (ii) A law enforcement officer;
    - (iii) A correctional officer; and
- (iv) A member of the Maryland National Guard who was a resident of the State at the time of death.
  - (b) There is a program of scholarships that are awarded under this section.
- (c) A child or spouse who can demonstrate a financial need to the Administration may apply to the Administration for a scholarship under this section.
- (d) (1) The Administration shall determine the amount of each scholarship under this section based on the financial need of the applicant.
- (2) Each scholarship pays the tuition and fees at any eligible institution for a maximum of 5 years.
- (3) The annual amount of a scholarship may not exceed the equivalent annual tuition and mandatory fees of the undergraduate in-state student at the University of Maryland College Park.]
