SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 48A - Insurance Code

490G.

- (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
 - (2) "Applicable change in status" means the death of the insured.
 - (3) "Dependent child" means an individual who:
 - (i) Is a child of the insured; and
- (ii) Either was covered under the group insurance contract as a qualified or an eligible dependent of the insured immediately prior to the applicable change in status or was born to a qualified secondary beneficiary as defined in subsection (a)(6)(i) of this section after the applicable change in status.
 - (4) "Group contract" means:
- (i) Any insurance contract or policy issued or delivered in this State to the employer of the insured by a nonprofit health service insurance plan or an insurance company which provides group hospital, medical, or surgical benefits to the employees of the employer on an expense-incurred basis; or
- (ii) Any contract between the employer of the insured and a health maintenance organization certified under Title 19, Subtitle 7 of the Health General Article to provide hospital, medical, or surgical benefits to the employees of the employer.
- (5) "Insured" means an employee who is a resident of this State and covered under a CURRENT OR PREDECESSOR group contract WITH THE SAME EMPLOYER for a period not less than 3 months.
- (6) "Qualified secondary beneficiary" means, with respect to the insured, an individual other than the insured who is:
- (i) A beneficiary under the group contract as the spouse of the insured for at least the immediately preceding 30-day period immediately preceding the applicable change in status; or
