In Harford county, for John Griffin thirty dollars, for William How thirty dollars, for Amos Evans thirty dollars. In Caroline county, for Porcus Chaffinch fifteen dollars, for Jesse Cox twenty dollars. In Montgomery county, for Abraham Bocroft, and Ann his wife, thirty dollars each, for Jane Butt thirty dollars, for Christopher Miller thirty dollars, for Betsy Burrass thirty dollars, for Jesse Severns, senr. and Teresa Severns, thirty dollars each, for Jackson Connell thirty dollars, for Ruth Case thirty dollars, for Nancy Grant thirty dollars; payable to themselves, or their orders respectively, or such person or persons as the said levy courts shall direct.

## CHAP. CCXLIV.

An Act to build a new Poor's House in Calvert County.

Passed Mar 12 1827

1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Lev, authorised That the levy court of Calvert county be and they are hereby authorised and empowered, to levy upon the assessable property of said county, such sum or sums of money as may enable them to purchase so much ground as they may think necessary, and to procure, or cause to be erected thereon, suitable buildings to answer for the reception of the poor of the county aforesaid; Provided, That the provisions of this act shall not take effect Provision until they have sold the present poor's house of that county, and the appurtenances thereunto belonging.

2. And be it enacted, That when the said buildings shall Buildings when have been procured or erected, they shall be delivered over to livered over to the trustees of the poor of the said county, and that the institution shall be liable to the laws, rules and regulations, prescribed

for the government of the present poor's house.

## CHAP. CCXLV.

An Act concerning the Washington Monument.

Passed Mar 12 1827

1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, 20,000 dollars authorised to be paid. That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby aut to managers thorised and required, to pay to the president, or to the managers of the Washington Monument, any sum not exceeding twenty thousand dollars, during the present year, for the further completion of the Washington Monument, provided that sum shall be received from the avails of the lottery system.

2. And be it enacted, That the inscriptions on the said Mo-Inteription on unp nument shall be expressive of the gratitude of the state of Maryland, and the Monument shall be held and considered as the

property of the state.
