

## RESOLUTIONS:

1826

**RESOLVED** by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the senators and representatives of this state in the congress of the United States, be and they hereby are requested, to exercise their best exertions to obtain an act to authorise the settlement of the state's claims for interest on monies expended for the United States in the prosecution of the last war with Great Britain, according to usage, and the equity of the matter.

**FURTHER RESOLVED**, That his excellency the governor be requested to cause the foregoing report, preamble and resolution, to be communicated severally to each of the senators and representatives of this state, in the congress of the United States.

### No. 7.

**RESOLVED**, That the time allowed to the commissioners, trustees, and other authorities, of the several literary institutions in this state, for making reports, mentioned in a resolution passed at December session eighteen hundred and twenty-four, be and the same is hereby extended till the first day of May next.

### No. 8.

The committee of grievances and courts of justice, to whom was referred the order of the house of delegates of the 25th instant, directing them to inquire into the character and objects of a work, proposed to be published by John V. L. McMahon, Esq. and to be entitled An Historical View of the Government of Maryland, in all its branches, legislative, executive and judiciary, from the æra of the grant of the charter, and the colonization of the state, to the present moment, and to report upon the expediency of subscribing for one hundred copies of the same, for the use of the state, report—That they have examined the materials for the proposed work, and that they unanimously recommend the adoption of the following resolution:

**RESOLVED** by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the governor and council be requested, to cause a national salute to be fired at sun-rise, at noon and at sun-set, on the twenty-second of this month, in commemoration of the birth of the illustrious General George Washington.
