CHAP. LXII.

Passed Fcb7, 1827 An Act to divorce Ann Culverwell, and her husband William Culverwell, of the City of Baltimore.

1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the said Ann Culverwell be, and she is hereby divorced from bed, board and mutual cohabitation, with her husband William Culverwell.

And be it enacted, That the said William Culverwell shalf claim indete any not, by virtue of his marriage with the said Ann Culverwell, be authorised to have or claim any right or interest in the estate, real, personal or mixed, of the said Ann Culverwell, to be by her acquired after the passage of this act; nor shall Ann Culverwell be authorised to have or claim any right or interest in the estate, real, personal or mixed, of the said William Culverwell, to be by him acquired after the passage of this act.

3. And be it enacted, That the said Ann Culverwell shall Ann to have the privileges of a fehave and exercise all the rights, privileges and immunities, and Mic sold be subject to all the legal responsibilities of a feme sole, in the same manner she would have been if she had never been married.
