with each and every of the conditions of the original act, except CHAP. 78. 'so far as the same are expressly altered by the provisions of this act.

4. And be it enected, That this act shall commonlee and be when to be in in force as soon as it shall have received the assent of the legislature of Virginia, of the congress of the United States, and of the Potomac Company.

CHAP, LYYIX.

An Act to authorise the sale of a part of the Real Estate of James W. I., Passed F. b 6, 1927 Weems, late of Prince-George's County, deceased.

1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Real evision with That Walter Bowie, and Amelia M. Bowie his wife, and Ro- nacl to be sold bert Bowie, and Margaret H. W. Bowie his wife, all of Prines-George's county, be and they are hereby authorised and empowered, to sell and convey, upon such terms as to them may seem expedient, all that part of the real estate of the said James W. L. Weems, lying in Calvert county in this state, which by last will and testament, dated on or about the twenty-third day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hufidred and eight, was devised by the said James W. L. Weems to the said Amelia M. Bowie, (then Amelia M. Wcems,) and to a certain Margaret Hall French, the ancestor of the before mentioned Margaret H. W. Bowie, as tenants in common.

2. And be it enacted, That any sale or conveyance made sale to have effect under the provisions of this act, shall have the same effect and validity, and no other, as they would have if the aforesaid Margaret II. W. Bowie was of the full age of twenty-one years; Provided however, that before making such sale, or convey-Proviso ance, the said Robert Bowie shall give bond, in such penalty, and with such security as the orphans court of Prince-George's county may approve, conditioned for the investment in such fund, as the said court may also direct, of such part of the proceeds as the said court may also direct, arising from any sale which may be made under this act, and to which the said Robert, and his said wife Margaret H. W. Bowie, may be entitled to, and for the sole and separate use of his said wife, and her heirs.

3. And be it enacted, That the said bond shall be recorded and to be recorded among the records of the said court, and a copy thereof, under the seal of such court, shall be as good and sufficient evidence in any courts of this state as the original would be if produced and proved.

CHAP. LXXX.

An Act to incorporate a Company in the City of Baltimore to be called The Bassed Feb 10, 1827 Vigilant Fire Company.

WHEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, that the Preamble members of the Vigilant Fire Company of the city of Baltimore, have provided themselves with a complete and efficient apparatus for the extinguishment of fires, and have adopted a constitution for the government of said company, and in order to give effect to the laws, rules and regulations, which have or may be established by the said company, it has been prayed that an act of incorporation may pass in their favour: Therefore,
