"One year passeth away and another cometh—so likewise 'tis with Almanacks—they are annual productions, whose destination and usefulness is temporary, and afterwards are thrown by and consigned to oblivion. . . . it is no wonder, when they become *old Almanacks* that we frequently see them made use of by the pastry-cooks, or flying in the tail of the school-boy's kite."
