On November 15, 1784, the inhabitants of Baltimore arranged for the election of a committee to consider the question of incorporating the town and on the 20th the committee met. They resolved on December 2 that the citizens of Baltimore ought to apply for an Act of Incorporation from the General Assembly as soon as possible. The committee requested a Town meeting on December 9 at the Court House for a full discussion of the proposed action. Not until 1796 was the town incorporated by the Maryland Assembly.
