The copy in the New York Public Library contains mss notes and additions in the hand of Jefferson. It was finally agreed to on April 23, 1784, and became the basis of the public land system of the United States. The general principles set forth in this act were developed into practical form in the Northwest Ordinance of 1787. The Committee, made up of Jefferson, Chase and Howell, offered an earlier resolution containing a provision for creating ten states out of the land between the Ohio and Mississippi rivers and providing that there should be no slavery in them after 1800, but both of these provisions were defeated and the original report was recommitted on March 17.
