The Methodist Episcopal Church in America was organized at the meeting at the Lovely Lane Meeting House on December 27, 1784. This item is a foundation stone in any collection relating to the religious history of the United States. Thomas Coke and Francis Asbury were the first bishops of the church. Note that the date of the sermon as given on the title page is incorrect and should be December 27, 1784. The sermon was frequently reprinted. The *Maryland Journal* of March 22, 1785, contains the announcement that it was just published and for sale for six-pence. The Maryland Historical Society has an edition of this sermon consisting of eight unsigned leaves. The title page agrees in every detail with that of the Baltimore edition except that the date has been corrected to 1785 and the line "Reprinted in England Verbatim" has been added to the page.
