James Young advertised in the *Maryland Gazette* on October 31, 1786 that he proposed to publish a directory on the first day of January, 1787. Subscriptions at 3/9 were taken by James Hayes. The directory was probably not published since no record of it has survived. The earliest Baltimore directory known was published in 1796.

The college was to be formally opened December 8 to 10, 1787 with a president and three teachers on the faculty. It was expected to be at least £1100 in debt when it opened. Archer of the Harford Historical Society which was printed in the *Bel Air Times* on February 24, 1893 and reprinted in 1924 in pamphlet form by the Bel Air Times Company.
