considerable demand for a German and English printing
office in Baltimore.

Not long after he came to Paltimore, Sower started another business in which his father and grandfather had engaged - the bookbinding trade. No advertisement of this occupation has been found in any contemporary newspaper, but on the end-papers of the New York Public Library's copy of the Whole Genuine and Complete Works of Josephus, printed by William Pechin in installments
