

eric's Castle,⁹⁹ a Gothic romance, printed for George Keatinge's book store, Hoch-Deutsches Lutherisches A B C und Namen-Buch,¹⁰⁰ the first German text book known to have been printed in Baltimore, Des Johann Lassenius Politische Geheimnis,¹⁰¹ Francis O'Kely's poem, The Disjointed Watch,¹⁰² an unlocated chart, apparently with religious subject matter, Eine Neue Charte und Sinnliche Abbildung,¹⁰³ and Der Neue Hoch Deutsche Americanische Calendar, auf das Jahr Christi 1796,¹⁰⁴ one of a series of almanacs which Sower had begun in Germantown in 1791 and which continued regularly until at least 1807.¹⁰⁵ Apparently there was considerable demand for a German and English printing office in Baltimore.

Not long after he came to Baltimore, Sower started another business in which his father and grandfather had engaged - the bookbinding trade. No advertisement of this occupation has been found in any contemporary newspaper, but on the end-papers of the New York Public Library's copy of the Whole Genuine and Complete Works of Josephus, printed by William Pechin in installments
