Only issue located for 1794, that of February 5,  
number 3, is printed on a half sheet, on one side,  
three columns to a page; but carries the notice:  
"The Rights of man will, in a few days, be printed  
on a whole sheet - price fourteen shillings per  
annum--and appear on the morning of every Wednesday."

Issued weekly.

Before April 28, 1794, Winter had taken John D.  
Cary into partnership. The imprint was doubtless  
changed to include both names.
