The new title was undoubtedly assumed in 1800, although the first issue located is that of Feb. 11, 1801, vol. 8, no. 30, whole no. 457, published by Matthias Bartgis."

The Baltimore Telegraphe, Nov. 8, 1800, quotes "From Bartgis's Republican gazette", so the change of title must have taken place before that date.
