

ferent denominations of churches are represented: Catholic, by the Ordo's, the Burial Service,²⁵ and publications of Bishop Carroll;²⁶ the Protestant Episcopal by the Journal of the Maryland Diocese for 1796 and 1797;²⁷ the Baptist by these pamphlets, Prophetic Conjectures on the French Revolution, 1794,²⁸ and Address from the Dissenting Brethren, Members of the Baptist Church, 1801; and the Society of Friends by the Revised Discipline, issued in 1794.²⁹ Charitable institutions were represented by the Rules and Constitution of the Society of St. George;³⁰ civic welfare institutions by the Constitution of the Reliance Property Commission³¹ (organized for protection against fire); and secret societies by the Proceedings of the Grand Lodge Freemasons of the State of Maryland ... 1799.³² Higher education in the state is represented by An Address of the Visitors and Governors of St. John's College.³³ Cultural life in Baltimore is represented by the 1797 and 1798 Catalogues of the Library Company of Baltimore³⁴ (for the printing of which,
