"Ordered, That the printer to the state strike one hundred copies of the said bill for the use of the legislature."—House V. & P., Nov. sess. 1805, p. 59 (Dec. 24).

The second reading of the bill did not take place until Jan. 13, 1806.

"Ordered, That the printer to the state strike five hundred copies of said bill for the use of the legislature."—House V. & P., Nov. sess. 1805, p. 54 (Dec. 19).

Maryland. General Assembly. House of Delegates.

[Bills, resolutions and reports containing subjects of a general nature. Annapolis, F. Green, 1805]

"Ordered, That the printer to the state be and he is hereby directed to print one hundred copies of every bill, resolution and report, containing subjects of a general nature, which shall be read by the clerk during the session, also, of all official papers, for the use of the members."—House V. & P., Nov. sess. 1805, p. 5 (Nov. 7).

In the absence of any existing copies of the printing thus ordered, it seems best to include these possible imprints in one blanket item. [365]
