In the Annapolis Maryland Gazette, Sept. 12, 1805, appears the following advertisement: "A few sets of the Laws from 1800 to 1804, both inclusive, handsomely bound, to be had at the Printing-Office." Were these bound with or without an added title page? If the former, no copy is known; if the latter (again no copy has been located), it would not constitute a new issue, since the parts were presumably remainders.
