Probably the catalogue advertised in the Baltimore American, Jan. 31, 1806, as "Saturday Evening ... in addition to ... New Books, will be sold a Valuable Library of Second-hand Books ... catalogues of the whole, will be ready for delivery on Saturday morning;" and on Apr. 18, 1806, as "To be sold by auction, to morrow ... Several thousand volumes of Books in Sheets. The particulars of which may be obtained from the printed catalogues ... ready for delivery this morning."
