Maryland. Governor (Robert Bowie)

(Circular.) Council Chamber Annapolis, March 31, 1806. Sir, In pursuance of the direction of the General Assembly of Maryland, I have the honour of transmitting to your Excellency an authenticated copy of a resolution passed at their last session, recommending an amendment of the Federal Constitution respecting the importation of slaves, which you will be pleased to submit to the legislature of the state over which you preside for its concurrence and adoption. I have the honour to be, with high consideration and respect, your Excellency's most obedient servant, [signed] Robert Bowie [11 lines, quoting the resolution] [Annapolis, 1806]

The resolution urged the prevention of further importation of slaves.
