In consequence of a handbill published by John Murray, relative to a dispute between him and me, it becomes necessary to require, for a short time, the suspension of public opinion, until it shall be proved, as well by publication of the correspondence between us, as by further information from undoubted authority that villany and cowardice are the predominant traits in the character of a miscreant, too pitiful to excite the contempt, much less the resentment of Jacob Gibson. December 25th, 1808. [Annapolis? 1808] broadside.
