[By the House of Delegates, June 7, 1809. Resolved, That John Eager Howard be one of the senators to represent this state in the senate of the United States till the fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and fifteen ...

By the Senate, June 8, 1809. Gentlemen of the House of Delegates, We have dissented from your resolution for the appointment of John Eager Howard ... Annapolis, Frederick Green, 1809.]

"Ordered, That the printer of the state strike five hundred copies of the message of this house, in answer to the message of the senate on the subject of the election of the senator for this state to the United States, for the use of the members of the legislature."—House V. & P., June sess. 1809, p. 15.
