

During the first two years almost all the circulation was confined to the large Prerogative Court series: Wills, Inventories, Inventories and Accounts, Accounts, Balance Books, Testamentary Proceedings. During the following two years the addition of the Anne Arundel and Baltimore County Deeds to the holdings of the Hall of Records is reflected in the circulation totals. Also certain materials, which had previously had no keys, were indexed and began to be used: Original Wills, Provincial Court Judgments. The figures for the first four years are given below:
