The policy which we began during the last fiscal year of repairing only those materials which are in constant use and which are in need of repair was continued during this year with good results. With the exception of the Provincial Court Judgments, which are now being indexed and repaired, there are no records frequently used which are badly in need of repair. There is no record, moreover, in such bad condition that it cannot be given to the public. It is hoped that in the near future we shall be able to get beyond the point of repairing where there has already been damage; it is better and cheaper to preserve than to repair.
