

demand except for the constant use of military service and census records. The use of these records rarely, if ever, appears in the Research Room circulation figures because our index cards which are open to the public carry all of the information in the record so that the record itself is never called for. Correspondence involving historical, legal, institutional problems, normally cared for by the Archivist, were not analyzed for source materials since the emphasis on printed books, reports of State offices, atlases, etc., would make such a survey difficult and relatively fruitless.
