PHOTOCOPYING

A marked increase was noted last year in the number of photocopies of its materials furnished by the Hall of Records. While the total receipts for this year for the combined services rendered by the Hall of Records exceed that of last year, receipts for photostating declined slightly. We may look forward, because of the rapid addition of new records, to an additional increase in such services. The word "service" is used advisedly for these copies are furnished at a loss to the Hall of Records: the money received is deposited in the General Funds of the State while the materials and labor are paid for out of the budget of the Hall of Records.
