Course in the History of Annapolis

At the request of the St. John's College, the Archivist arranged for a course to be given in the history of Annapolis at the Hall of Records. The purpose of this course was to give those residents of this area who might be interested an opportunity to prepare themselves for the Annapolis Tercentenary. The class met weekly from January 31 through May 2. The lectures on political, economic, archival, and governmental history were given by members of the staff of the Hall of Records, two by the Archivist, two by Mr. Skordas, and three by Mr. Thomas. The history of the St. John's College was given by Dr. Ford K. Brown, the history of the United States Naval Academy by Professor E. B. Potter. The Colonial houses were discussed by Mr. Orlando Ridout IV, and "Whitehall" was made the subject of a special lecture offered by Mr. Charles Scarlett, Jr. The religious history of Annapolis was outlined briefly by Mr. John P. Trimmer.
