Mrs. Lois Clark attended the annual meeting of the American Historical Association and she spoke on "Genealogy and Public Records of Colonial Maryland" to the Dorset Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution at Cambridge.

At the 25th Annual meeting of the Society of American Archivists held October 5-7, 1961 at Kansas City, Mr. Skordas delivered a paper—subsequently published—entitled "Maryland's County Records—The Eclectic Approach."
