CHAP. 211

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the said Hugh Boyle may sign, seal, execute and deliver all conveyances and assurances necessary to effect the power hereby granted to him.

To execute conveyance.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That it shall be the duty of the said Hugh Boyle, before he proceeds to act, to give bond to the state of Maryland, with such security as shall be approved by the judges of the orphans' court of Baltimore county, in the penalty of five thousand dollars, conditioned for the faithful discharge of his duties under this act, and that it shall be the duty of the said Boyle to return to the said court a statement of the leases made by him, shewing the terms thereof, and to account to said court for the rent received by him, in the same manner as guardians are by law compelled to account for the rents of their wards, and appropriate the same.

CHAPTER 212.

*A supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate the Elkton and Susquehanna Bridge Turnpike Company*

Passed March 15, 1828

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That so much of the seventh section of the act to which this is a supplement, as requires the president and managers, in locating and laying out the said road, to run the same from the Port Deposit bridge down the shore until they come to the road leading from Port Deposit to Battle Swamp, at or near to Henry S. Stiles' store, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

Clause repealed.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the said president and managers, in locating the said road, shall have full power and authority to run the same in such manner as they may think most advantageous for the public interest, as also for the interest of the said company, from the Port Deposit bridge to North East.

Full authority to locate.

CHAPTER 213.

*An act for the relief of Charles H. W. Wharton, in the District of Columbia, and Rebecca Wharton, his wife.*

Passed March 15, 1828

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That John Scott, of the city of Baltimore, trustee, under and by virtue of a deed of trust from Henry Waring, Charles H. W. Wharton and Rebecca, his wife, bearing date on or about the thirtieth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty five, and recorded among the land records of Montgomery county court, (Maryland,) in liber G. folio two hundred and twelve, and so forth, be, and he is hereby authorised and empowered, by
