

Compensation \$2 per day.

Allowance for return days.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That from and after the passage of this act, the judges and clerks of elections in and for all that part of Baltimore county out of the limits of the city of Baltimore, shall not be entitled to receive more than two dollars per day, as a compensation for their services.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That no return judge of election in and for all that part of Baltimore county hereinbefore mentioned, shall be allowed for more than three days in addition to the day of holding the election; at the discretion of the commissioners of Baltimore county, and according to the distance said return judges may have to travel respectively, to make their returns, any other law, custom or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

CHAPTER 84.

*An act for the appointment of trustees for the sale of the real estate of Thomas Gorsuch, late of Baltimore county.* Passed Feb'y. 20, 1828.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, Charles Gorsuch, Joshua Gorsuch, William Gorsuch, Ann Collett, John Collett, and Hezekiah his wife, Thomas Crayton, and Elizabeth his wife, heirs at law of Thomas Gorsuch, late of Baltimore county, deceased, have set forth in their memorial to the General Assembly of Maryland, that their father died, seized of a large real estate situate in Baltimore county, in the state of Maryland, leaving a widow and nine children, including your memorialists, and that proceedings were duly had under the act to direct descents passed in the year seventeen hundred and eighty-six, to ascertain whether or not said real estate could be divided advantageously among all the parties interested therein, and that the commissioners appointed for that purpose, had reported that the same could not be so divided, and that said report had been subsequently confirmed by Baltimore county court, and that after such confirmation of said report, the heirs at law had refused to elect to take said real estate at the appraisement made thereof by the said commissioners, and that four of the said commissioners had died before sale was effected, and that the fifth commissioner had removed from the state of Maryland, whereby further proceedings under said commission have been wholly suspended, to the great detriment of all the parties interested, and have prayed the General Assembly to enact a law appointing one or more trustees to make sale of the real estate aforesaid; and whereas the existing laws of the state do not furnish any remedy for this grievance, and the prayer of the said memorial seemeth reasonable and proper: Therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Ebenezer L. Finley and David Stewart, Esquires, of the city of Baltimore, be, and they are hereby appointed trustees for the sale of the real estate of Thomas Gorsuch, late of Baltimore county, deceased, the course and manner of
