

CHAPTER 87.

CHAP. 87.

An act to continue in force an act passed at December session eighteen hundred and twenty three, chapter one hundred and eighty-five, entitled, an act to repair the highways and bridges in certain parts of the city of Baltimore.

Passed Feb'y 27,
1828

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That hereafter the mayor and city council of Baltimore shall have power to lay and collect a direct tax, not exceeding fifty cents in the hundred dollars, on the assessment of all lands and houses in the said city, lying without the present limits of direct taxation and within the exterior limits of said city, for the purposes, and to be applied in the manner as prescribed in an act passed at December session eighteen hundred and twenty-three, chapter one hundred and eighty-five, entitled, an act to repair the highways and bridges in certain parts of the city of Baltimore, any thing in said act contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

Powers to levy

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act and the aforesaid act, entitled, an act to repair the highways and bridges in certain parts of the city of Baltimore shall continue in force until the first day of December eighteen hundred and thirty-three, and until the end of the next session of the general assembly which shall happen thereafter.

CHAPTER 88.

An act for the relief of Gabriel Isaacs, an insolvent debtor of the city of Baltimore.

Passed Feb'y. 23,

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commissioners of insolvent debtors for the city and county of Baltimore, and Baltimore county court, be, and they are hereby respectively authorised, on the application of Gabriel Isaacs, for the benefit of the insolvent laws of this state, to extend to him the benefit of the said laws without requiring him to prove that he has resided for the last two years within the state of Maryland, on his complying with the other requisitions and provisions of the said law: *Provided,* That the said Isaacs satisfies the said commissioners that he did not come into this state for the purpose of obtaining the benefit of the said insolvent laws.
