Treasurer to pay \$250 for Denton, and \$250 for Hillsboro' Academies

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That it shall and may be lawful for the treasurer of the western shore, annually hereafter on the first Monday in October, to pay over unto the trustees of the Denton academy hereinafter named, or a majority of them, and their successors, the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, to be used by them for the purpose of education in Denton, and that the remaining two hundred and fifty dollars shall be paid over to the trustees of the Hillsborough school, or their order, for the purpose of education in Hillsborough as heretofore.

Trustees of Denton academy

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That Joseph Richardson, Doctor Charles Ilden, Doctor George T. Martin, James Sangston, Edward B. Hardcastle, Joseph P. W. Richardson and Robert T. Keene, b , and the same are hereby constituted and appointed a board of trustees for a school or academy, to be established in Denton in Caroline county aforesaid, to be called and known by the name of the Denton Academy, and that the said trustees, or a majority of them or their successors hereafter to be appointed by virtue of this act, shall have full power to manage the affairs of said school.

Corporate powers granted

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That the said trustees shall hereafter be considered a corporate body, and that they have power to make by-laws for their government, and to alter and change the same from time to time, as they may find convenient; to make a common seal for their use, and to alter and change the same at pleasure; and that the said trustees, or a majority of them, are hereby authorised and required from time to time as often as any vacancy shall happen in their board by death or otherwise to fill up said vacancy with some suitable person or persons, residing in the said county.

Legal capacity.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted,* That the said trustees and their successors, shall be capable in law, to sue and be sued, to plead and be impleaded in their corporate capacity for any matter or cause of action under the laws of this state.

CHAPTER 90.

Passed Feb'y. 25, 1828.

An act to authorise George Parker, senior, of Somerset County, to remove a negro boy, from the state of Delaware to this state.

Privilege granted!

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That George Parker, senior, of Somerset county, is hereby authorised and empowered to import and bring into this state from the state of Delaware, his negro slave named Isaac, and dispose of said negro without incurring the penalties of the laws now existing.
