

New section. Monday in November, eighteen hundred and ninety-one, in pursuance of section one of Article seven of the Constitution of the State and of such Commissioners as shall be elected or appointed hereafter," be repealed and re-enacted with amendments, and an additional section added thereto to be known as section 4, so as to read as follows: and,

Terms of County Commissioners. SEC. 2. *Be it enacted*, That at the expiration of the two years' term, as hereinbefore provided, at the general election that will then ensue, a County Commissioner to succeed the County Commissioner whose term will then expire, shall be elected to serve for the term of six years or until his successor shall have been elected and qualified, and at the expiration of the four years' term at the general election that will then ensue, a County Commissioner to succeed the County Commissioner whose term will then expire, shall be elected for the term of six years or until his successor shall have been elected and qualified, and at the expiration of the six years' term, at the general election that will then ensue, a County Commissioner to succeed the County Commissioner whose term will then expire, shall be elected to serve for the term of six years or until his successor shall have been elected and qualified, and in this order and according to this plan, the succession to the office of County Commissioner shall be kept up and be perpetual thereafter.

Terms of present incumbents. SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That in accordance with this plan and to establish this order of succession, the three County Commissioners now holding said office in said county, viz, John E. George, John F. Godwin and James B. Bright, shall hold their respective offices as follows: The said John E. George shall hold his said office for a period of six years from the date of his election, on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1893, or until his successor shall have been elected and qualified; and the said John F. Godwin shall hold his said office for a period of six years from the date of his election, on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1895, or until his successor shall have been elected and qualified; and the said James B. Bright shall hold his said office for a period of six years from the date of the election of his predecessor, William H. Cecil, on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1891, or until his successor shall have been elected and qualified.

Eligibility. SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That no County Commissioner shall be eligible to said office for more than two consecutive terms; and that in case of the death, removal or resignation of
