Effective.

CHAPTER 181.

AN ACT to repeal Sections 33 and 34 of Article 23 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Wicomico County," sub-title "Delmar," as amended by Chapter 449 of the Acts of Assembly of 1894, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Repeal.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That sections 33 and 34 of Article 23 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Wicomico County," sub-title "Delmar," as the same was amended by chapter 449 of the Acts of Assembly of 1894, be, and the same are hereby repealed, and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Male citizens to work on streets.

33. All male citizens of the town of Delmar between the ages of twenty-one and fifty years (except ministers of the Gospel) shall work on the streets of said town not less than one uor more than two days in each year, or furnish a substitute of the aforesaid age to do the work or pay to the bailiff on or before the day on which the work is to be done the sum of one dollar for each day, for the use of the said town; and the bailiff shall give at least five days' notice of the time and place to meet to do said work, and shall on or before the 15th day of May in each year post in some public place a full and complete list of the names of all persons notified, the names of the substitutes furnished and by whom such a substitute was furnished, and the time worked by each person or substitute, and the amount of money paid by each person in lieu of performing such road duty; and any person paying said money on or before the 15th day of July in any year shall receive a discount of ten per cent. on the same for that year.

Penalty for refusal.

34. Any person failing to comply with the preceding section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be arrested and brought before some justice of the peace for Wicomico county, upon a warrant issued by said justice in the name of the State of Maryland, and, upon proof of such failure, to be find one dollar for each day so neglected and the costs of the
