CHAPTER 33.

AN ACT to add a new section to the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, Article 16, title "Chancery," sub-title "Non Compos Mentis," to follow Section 104, and to be designated as "104 A."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the following new section be and the same is hereby added to the Code of Public General Laws, Article 16, title "Chancery," sub-title "Non Compos Mentis," to follow section 104, and to be designated as "104 A," and to read as follows: New section.

104 A. In case of application by petition of a person who has been adjudged a lunatic or *non compos mentis* to have the commission superseded on the ground of recovery or restoration to a sound state of mind and capacity to manage his affairs, the petitioner shall be entitled to have the question submitted to a jury empaneled under the order of the court for the purpose, whose verdict shall be binding on the court, unless set aside for cause. SEC. 2. *Be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Effective.
