Preamble.

Whereas, It is desirable that the term of the county treasurer should expire simultaneously with the fiscal year in said county, to wit., on the first Monday in July in each and every year; therefore,

Term extended, SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the term of office of George A. Deakyne, the present county treasurer of Caroline county, be, and the same is hereby extended until the first Monday in July, in the year 1898; provided, however, that the said George A. Deakyne shall be required to give a new bond in such sum and with such surety or sureties as is now required by law, conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties of his said office for the term hereby extended.

Repeal.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That section 60 of article 6 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Caroline County," sub-title "County Treasurer," be, and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, so as to read as follows:

Election of treasurer.

60. At the general election for county officers in every fourth year on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, accounting from the year 1897, a county treasurer shall be elected by the qualified voters of Caroline county, who shall hold office for the term of four years from the first Monday in July next following his election, and until his successor shall qualify.
