

cess Anne, Dublin, Fairmount and Mount Vernon election districts of Somerset county, for the years eighteen hundred and ninety-two and eighteen hundred and ninety-three, and not yet collected by the said Nathan J. P. Tull, may be collected within two years from and after the passage of this act.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That all such parts of the act of eighteen hundred and eighty-eight, chapter one hundred and thirty-seven, and any amendments thereto as are applicable to the enforcing of the collection of taxes in said county for the years of eighteen hundred and ninety two and eighteen hundred and ninety-three, shall be applicable to the collection of said State and county taxes for the years of eighteen hundred and ninety-two and eighteen hundred and ninety-three, in the hands of said Nathan J. P. Tull, and shall be and remain so applicable thereto for two years from and after the passage of this act. Acts in force.

CHAPTER 417.

AN ACT to repeal Section 2 of Chapter 468 of the Acts passed at January Session, 1884, being Section 244 of Article 10 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Dorchester County," sub-title "Oysters," and Section 155 of Article 21 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Talbot County," sub-title "Oysters," and Section 10 of Chapter 359 of the Acts of 1878, being Section 162 of Article 21 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Talbot County," sub-title "Oysters," relating to taking oysters with scoops or scrapes in the waters of Choptank River, and to enact the same with amendments.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That section 2 of chapter 468 of the acts passed at January session, 1884, being section 244 of article 10 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title Dorchester County, sub-title Oysters; and section 155 of article 21 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title Talbot, sub-title Oysters, and section 10 of chapter 359 of the Acts of 1878, being section 162 of article 21 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title Talbot County, sub-title Repeal.
