*Thirty-ninth.* To the bequest of fifty dollars for the benefit of Zion Reformed Churchyard Fund, in Hagerstown, Maryland, contained in the last will and testament of Eliza Wahtz, late of Washington county, deceased, admitted to probate on the twenty-fifth day of July, eighteen hundred and ninety-three, and recorded in the office of the Register of Wills of said county.

*Fortieth.* To the following bequests under the last will and testament of Ann Nufer, late of Washington county, deceased, said will having been probated on the twenty-third day of March, eighteen hundred and ninety-four, and recorded in the office of the Register of Wills of said county, viz: To the trustees of St. Peter's Church, commonly known as Beard's church, of Washington county, the sum of seventy dollars to be used for a certain purpose; to the trustees of St. Peter's Church, commonly known as Beard's church, and incorporated as the German Evangelical Congregation, adjoining the plantation of Major Beard, in Washington county, the sum of one hundred dollars, to be held in trust by the trustees of said church for certain purposes; and to the trustees of St. Peter's Church, commonly known as Beard's church, in Washington county, the sum of five hundred dollars.
