

CHAP. 9. for the payment of only ninety-one members of the House of Delegates; and,

Preamble. WHEREAS, Under and by virtue of the authority contained in section 5 of Article 3 of the Constitution and chapter 3 of the Acts of 1901, the Governor did, by his proclamation issued July 23, 1901, arrange the apportionment of representation in the House of Delegates of Maryland of the several counties and the city of Baltimore to the number of ninety-five members thereof; therefore,

Appropriation. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the sum of eighteen hundred dollars is hereby appropriated to pay the per diem of four additional members of the House of Delegates of the session of 1902, at five dollars per day, and the Treasurer of the State is hereby authorized to pay on the warrant of the Comptroller the said sum of money herein appropriated for the object and purpose herein specified to or upon the order of the persons entitled to receive the same.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 10.

AN ACT to appropriate certain sums of money to the Baltimore Sun and other newspapers for publishing notice of the proposed Constitutional Amendments authorized to be submitted to the vote of the people under the provisions of chapters 185, 432 and 469 of the Acts of 1900.

Appropriate certain sums of money. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Comptroller of the Treasury be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant upon the Treasurer of the State in favor of the Baltimore Sun for \$955.50, the Baltimore American for \$711.20, the Baltimore Star for \$680, the German Correspondent for \$475.20, the Baltimore World for \$548, and in favor of the following newspapers for \$150 each: Mining Journal, Frostburg; Alleganian, Cumberland; Evening Times, Cumberland; Independent, Cumberland; Republican, Annapolis; Evening Capitol, Annapolis; Advertiser, Annapolis; Maryland Gazette, Annapolis; Record, Annapolis; Maryland Journal, Towson; Argus, Catonsville; Democrat, Towson; Baltimore County Union, Towson; Journal, Prince Frederick; Gazette, Prince Frederick; Journal, Denton; Free Press, Greensboro; New Farm, Preston; Advocate, Westminster; American Sentinel, Westminster;
