declaration
filed.

the board, file a written declaration, duly sworn to before a justice of the peace or notary public, stating the pharmacy or pharmacies in which he has had the experience demanded in sections 9 and 11. Any one swearing falsely in the affidavit so filed shall be deemed guilty of perjury.

Conspicu-
ously posted.

SEC. 13. Every person receiving a pharmacist's or assistant pharmacist's certificate shall keep the same conspicuously posted in his place of business.

Certificate
declared
void.

SEC. 14. *And be it further enacted*, That any certificate obtained by false representation shall be void, and the offender shall be fined not more than fifty dollars, or imprisonment for thirty days, or both, in the discretion of the Court.

May sell and
compound
drugs.

SEC. 14 A. *And be it further enacted*, That nothing in this Act shall prevent regularly licensed physicians of the State of Maryland from selling and compounding drugs and medicines as a pharmacist.

Null and void

SEC. 15. *And be it further enacted*, That all Acts or parts of Acts pertaining to the practice of pharmacy in the State of Maryland, in so far as they conflict with this Act, are hereby void.

Shall not
apply
to Talbot
county.

SEC. 15½. *And be it enacted*, That the provisions of this Act shall not apply to Talbot county.

How to be
construed.

SEC. 16. Provided, however, that nothing in this Act shall be construed as preventing general merchants of the counties of the State or of Baltimore city from selling such drugs and medicines as have heretofore been handled by the general merchants of the State of Maryland, or any registered physician of this State from personally compounding and dispensing drugs and medicines.

SEC. 17. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act shall go into effect immediately upon its passage.

CHAPTER 180.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments section 251 of Article 10 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title, "Dorchester County," sub-title "Oysters," and to repeal and re-enact with amendments Sections 155 and 162 of Article 21 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Talbot County," sub-title "Oysters," as said sections were repealed and re-enacted with amendments by the Acts of 1900, Chapter 674, said Sections being co-ordinate sections of said Article, applicable to the waters of Choptank river in common between Dorchester and Talbot counties.
