Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the County Commissioners of Harford county be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to levy annually a sum of money, not to exceed seventy-five dollars each, for the support of Eliza Cavender, Martha Standeford and Eldridge Gallup, of said county.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That sub-section 3 of section 14 of chapter 78 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland of the Session of 1898, entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments chapter 621 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland of 1894, entitled an Act to incorporate the Town of Kensington in Montgomery county, Maryland, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted, so as to read as follows:
