Section 159. The County Commissioners, if, in their discretion, they may deem it expedient, may appoint a person of skill and experience as superintendent of the roads of the county, with such duties as the said County Commissioners may prescribe. The said superintendent of public roads shall give bond in such penalty and with such security as they may fix and approve, and with such conditions as they may prescribe in regard to the duties to be by him performed. He shall hold office for the term of one year from the time of his appointment and qualification, and receive therefor a salary not to exceed three hundred dollars per annum.

CHAP. 227. Superintendent of roads appointed.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That all laws and parts of laws inconsistent with this Act be and the same are hereby Repeal. repealed, and that this Act take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 228.

AN ACT to repeal Chapter 235 of the Acts of 1894, and re-enact the same with amendments.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That chapter 235 of the Acts of 1894 be repealed and re-enact. and re-enacted, so as to read as follows:

SEC. 2. That it shall not be lawful for the clerk of the Court of Common Pleas of Baltimore City to issue license to Unlawful to any person or persons or body corporate to sell spirituous or sell or give fermented liquors or lager beer nearer than one-half of a mile, etc. in all directions, from Walbrook public school, formerly known as annex school No. 15, in the city of Baltimore.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
